

What to Pick Up from the RC - High School (9th - 12th Grade)

The titles contained in this guide are titles chosen by JCS subject area specialists by grade level. These are items stocked in the Resource Center (unless otherwise noted), and available for immediate pick up or order through the online catalog, Destiny. **For high school core courses, be sure to review the course titles carefully and order for your student based on grade level and core course placement.** For elective courses, we have many other titles available in the Resource Center, and opportunities for vendor online courses. Speak with the high school counselor and/or your EF about the variety of options available for high school, including JCS Academy courses, Odysseyware, community college, and BYU online courses. We highly recommend that you take a day to go and visit the Resource Center during business hours to look through the many curricular options JCS has. You may check out up to 50 items per student, which includes EMR (educational material resource) purchases for items not found in the Resource Center.

Below is a quick guide to how to order through the Online Catalog. For more detailed information on Resources, please visit the Parent Portal and check out the Resource Center FAQs under the Resource Center tab from the menu on the left. Note - Please log in as the student with the student's username and password combination to place a Hold for the requested resource materials. Request each student's "Holds" via their own name, rather than grouped with their siblings.

- 1. Go to julian.follettdestiny.com
- 2. Landing Page Select the student's "Site." Note: Home Study students select JCS Pine Hills Resource Center
- 3. Pop-up Logon window or Top Right, Arrow door
- 4. Logon as the student using student email address and password combination
- 5. Search Title or Keyword to locate materials
- 6. Click on the title link for more info if needed (Red flag Out means there are no copies available)
- 7. If there are copies available (Green Flag In),
- 8. Click on the HOLD link
